HOW DOES THE MICROCHIP GET MY LOST PET BACK HOME?

* Your pet is taken to a veterinarian, pet shop or animal shelter to be scanned for a chip number.

- They go to www.petmicrochiplookup.org to verify that the chip is registered, and they get the number of our 24/7/365 pet recovery hotline.
- One phone call, and they have YOUR phone number... and your pet is on his way back to you!

WILL THE MICROCHIP EVER NEED TO BE REPLACED?

No. It will be readable for the lifetime of your pet. Each microchip has a bio-compatible protein coating that keeps it secured in the spot where it was injected.



HOW MANY PLACES HAVE A MICROCHIP READER/SCANNER?

Well over 50,000 facilities in the U.S. now use universal scanners. They are also widely used in other countries. The technology is inexpensive and can be found at veterinary offices, animal shelters, animal control units, pet shops and most pet kennels.
